Proposals to amend the biennial questionnaire, including an approved layout and supporting notes for guidance

Note by the Executive Director

- 1. In its resolution 42/11, entitled "Guidelines for reporting on the follow-up to the twentieth special session of the General Assembly", the Commission on Narcotic Drugs adopted a unified, single questionnaire that covers the information required on all action plans and measures adopted by the General Assembly at its twentieth special session, devoted to countering the world drug problem together. In the same resolution, the Commission decided to assess the reporting guidelines and questionnaires at regular intervals in order to ensure that they continued to meet the needs of Member States. Consideration would also be given to streamlining the annual reports questionnaire submitted by Member States.
- 2. At the first part of its forty-fourth session, the Commission adopted resolution 44/2, entitled "First biennial report of the Executive Director on the progress achieved by Governments in meeting the goals and targets for the years 2003 and 2008 set out in the Political Declaration adopted by the General Assembly at its twentieth special session, devoted to countering the world drug problem together". In that resolution, the Commission requested the Executive Director to identify elements of the biennial questionnaire that might need adjustment, taking

into account the difficulties encountered and deficiencies perceived in completing the first biennial questionnaire, and to submit proposals for amendments to the Commission for adoption at its reconvened forty-fourth session, including an improved layout and supporting notes for guidance. The revised biennial questionnaire (see annex) has been prepared in response to that request.

I. Introduction

In paragraph 20 of the Political Declaration adopted by the General Assembly at its twentieth special session, devoted to countering the world drug problem together (resolution S-20/2, annex, of 10 June 1998), the Assembly called upon Member States to report biennially to the Commission on Narcotic Drugs on their efforts to meet the goals and targets established for the years 2003 and 2008, and requested the Commission to analyse those reports in order to enhance the cooperative effort to combat the world drug problem.

To enable the Commission to fulfil the above-mentioned mandate, replies to the present questionnaire should contain the information requested as well as any relevant changes that have occurred during the past two years. It is understood that, in replying to the questionnaire, States should provide answers that are as full as possible, bearing in mind the Political Declaration adopted by the Assembly at its twentieth special session. States should also provide, as appropriate, information on any difficulties encountered in answering the questions, as well as explanations of any negative answers. Additional information and explanations should be provided, as deemed necessary, to complement the replies given in the questionnaire.

The first reporting cycle on the implementation of the action plans and measures adopted by the special session covered the period up to 2000. In the present questionnaire, Governments are invited to provide information on action taken up to January 2001.

Please note that **only one answer** may be given to a question with answering options indicated by \bigcirc . **More than one answer** may be given to a question with answering options indicated by \square .
