## **Extensions of ongoing country programmes**

## Note by the secretariat

### Summary

In accordance with Executive Board decision 2009/11, this note informs the Executive Board of the one-year extensions of the country programmes for Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Congo, Cuba, Mexico and Sierra Leone, all approved by the Executive Director.

The note further presents the reasons for the proposed one-year extension of the country programme for the Syrian Arab Republic, following a previous one-year extension. The Executive Board is requested to approve this programme extension.

#### The Executive Board

- 1. *Takes note* of the one-year extensions of the country programmes for Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Congo, Cuba, Mexico and Sierra Leone, which were approved by the Executive Director and are presented in table 1.
