Report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Support Mission in Libya (\$\sqrt{2018}/780\$)

The agenda was adopted without objection.

The President invited the representative of Libya to participate in the meeting in accordance with rule 37 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution contained in document S/2018/836, submitted by the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

The Council proceeded to vote on the draft resolution (\$\frac{\sigma}{2018/836}\$) before it.

Decision: The draft resolution (\$\frac{\strace{S}}{2018}/836\) received 15 votes in favour, none against and no abstentions, and was adopted unanimously as resolution 2434(2018)

Identical letters dated 19 January 2016 from the Permanent Representative of Colombia to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General and the President of the Security Council (S/2016/53)

The Council proceeded to vote on the draft resolution (\$\frac{\sigma}{2017/834}\$) before it.

Decision: The draft resolution (\$\frac{\strace{S}}{2018}/834\) received 15 votes in favour, none against and no abstentions, and was adopted unanimously as resolution 2435(2018).

The agenda was adopted without objection.

The President invited Mr. Michael Keating, Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Somalia and Head of the United Nations Assistance Mission in Somalia; Mr. Francisco Madeira, Special Representative of the Chairperson of the African Union Commission for Somalia and Head of the African Union Mission in Somalia; and Ms. Phumzile Mlambo Ngcuka, Executive Director of the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women, to participate in the meeting in accordance with rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure.

The Council began its consideration of the item and heard briefings by Mr. Keating, Mr. Madeira (via video-teleconference from Mogadishu) and Ms. Mlambo-Ngcuka.

The President invited the representative of Somalia to participate in the meeting in accordance with rule 37 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure.

Statements were made by the representatives of the United Kingdom, Ethiopia, the Plurinational State of Bolivia, Côte d'Ivoire, Peru, Sweden, France, China, the Netherlands, Kazakhstan, Equatorial Guinea, Poland, Kuwait, the Russian Federation, and by the President, speaking in her capacity as the representative of the United States.
