1. By a communication dated 24 January 1975, the Secretary-General, in accordance with Article 5 of the Statute of the International Court of Justice, invited national groups to undertake the nomination of candidates for the election, to be held during the thirtieth regular session of the General Assembly, to fill the five vacancies in the International Court of Justice which will occur on 5 February 1976 when the terms of office of the following five members of the Court expire:

Mr. M. Lachs (Poland);
Mr. F. Ammoun (Lebanon);
Mr. C. Bengzon (Philippines);
Mr. S. Petré (Sweden);
Mr. C. D. Onyeama (Nigeria).

2. An alphabetical list of candidates, as required by Article 7 of the Statute of the Court, was circulated to the

General Assembly and to the Security Council by the Secretary-General in document A/10182-S/11802 and Corr.1. That list contained information available as at 1 August 1975. Subsequent nominations and other information relating to candidatures were circulated in addenda 1 to 10 to that document.

3. At the 2393rd plenary meeting of the General Assembly, on 5 November 1975, the Assembly, at the suggestion of its President, requested the Secretary-General to issue a consolidated alphabetical list, containing all the information previously circulated in documents A/10182-S/11802 and Corr.1 and Add.1-10. The present document is issued in compliance with that request (see annex).³

4. Curricula vitae of the candidates have been circulated in document A/10183-S/11803.

³ In addition to the candidates appearing in the present document, Mr. Christopher O. Cole (Sierra Leone), Mr. Edilbert Razafindralambo (Madagascar) and Mr. Mustafa Kamil Yasseen (Iraq) were nominated, but the Secretary-General has been informed that they do not wish to be considered for election at the present time.

The Secretary-General has the honour to submit to the General Assembly and to the Security Council the following communication, dated 6 November 1975, which he has received from the Permanent Representative of Ghana:

"The Permanent Representative of Ghana to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honour to inform him that the Ghana National Group has decided not to press the candidature of Mr. Justice Patrick Dankwa Anim for election to the membership of the International Court of Justice.

"The candidature of Mr. Justice Anim is accordingly hereby withdrawn."

The Secretary-General has the honour to submit to the General Assembly and to the Security Council the following communication, dated 13 November 1975, which he has received from Mr. Stephan Verosta:

"I have the honour to refer to document A/10182/Rev.1-S/11802/Rev.1 which contains the list of candidates nominated by national groups for the election of five members of the International Court of Justice. While I deeply appreciate the honour paid to me, I must respectfully request you to be kind enough to inform the General Assembly and the Security Council that I do not wish to be considered as a candidate."

- Mr. Sture Petrén (Sweden);
- Mr. Charles D. Onyeama (Nigeria).
