The Secretary-General has the honour to submit to the General Assembly and to the Security Council the following communication, dated 6 November 1975, which he has received from the Permanent Representative of Ghana:

"The Permanent Representative of Ghana to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honour to inform him that the Ghana National Group has decided not to press the candidature of Mr. Justice Patrick Dankwa Anim for election to the membership of the International Court of Justice.

"The candidature of Mr. Justice Anim is accordingly hereby withdrawn."

The Secretary-General has the honour to submit to the General Assembly and to the Security Council the following communication, dated 13 November 1975, which he has received from Mr. Stephan Verosta:

"I have the honour to refer to document A/10182/Rev.1-S/11802/Rev.1 which contains the list of candidates nominated by national groups for the election of five members of the International Court of Justice. While I deeply appreciate the honour paid to me, I must respectfully request you to be kind enough to inform the General Assembly and the Security Council that I do not wish to be considered as a candidate."

ACTION TAKEN BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

On 17 November 1975, the General Assembly at its 2408th plenary meeting and the Security Council at its 1855th meeting, voting independently, elected five members to the International Court of Justice to fill the vacancies occurring on the expiration of the terms of office of the following judges:

Mr. Cesar Bengzon (Philippines);

Mr. Sture Petrén (Sweden);

Mr. Charles D. Onyeama (Nigeria).
