REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE ADMISSION OF NEW MEMBERS CONCERNING
THE APPLICATION OF THE REPUBLIC OF VANUATU FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE
UNITED NATIONS

1. At the 2290th meeting on 8 July 1981, the Security Council had before it the application of the Republic of Vanuatu (S/14506) for admission to membership in the United Nations. In accordance with rule 59 of the provisional rules of procedure and in the absence of any objection, the President of the Council referred the application to the Committee on the Admission of New Members for examination and report.
2. At its 67th meeting on 8 July, the Committee considered the application of the Republic of Vanuatu.
3. The representatives of France and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland submitted the following draft resolution, which was also sponsored by China, the German Democratic Republic, Ireland, Japan, Mexico, Niger, Panama, the Philippines, Spain, Tunisia, Uganda, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the United States of America:

"The Security Council,

"Having examined the application of the Republic of Vanuatu for admission to the United Nations (S/14506),

"Recommends to the General Assembly that the Republic of Vanuatu be admitted to membership in the United Nations."
4. The Committee unanimously decided to recommend to the Security Council the adoption of the draft resolution concerning the admission of the Republic of Vanuatu to membership in the United Nations.
