LETTER DATED 1 AUGUST 1997 FROM THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have the honour to refer to Security Council resolution 1123 (1997) of 30 July 1997, by which the Council decided to establish the United Nations Transition Mission in Haiti (UNTMIH).

Having completed the customary consultations, I propose that the military component of the Mission consist of personnel from Canada and Pakistan.

I also propose that the following States contribute the police component: Benin, Canada, France, India, Mali, Togo and United States of America.

All the above-mentioned States have stated that they are prepared to make the necessary personnel available to the Mission.

I should be grateful if you would bring these matters to the attention of the members of the Security Council.
