Addendum

1. In paragraph 67 of my report to the Security Council dated 12 March 1998 (S/1998/227), I recommended that the Council approve the increase in resources required for the proposals outlined in paragraphs 37 to 43 of the report.

2. It is estimated that the costs associated with the additional deployment of 30 International Police Task Force (IPTF) monitors in the United Nations Mission in Bosnia and Herzegovina (UNMIBH) for a period of 3 months would be approximately \$0.9 million. It is also estimated that the costs associated with a programme of court monitoring by UNMIBH, referred to in paragraphs 44 to 46 of the report, for a period of three months would be approximately \$1.1 million.

3. Should the Security Council decide to deploy additional police monitors, I would then seek the additional resources required from the General Assembly. A breakdown of the estimated financial requirements is provided by main category of expenditure, for information purposes, in the annex to the present addendum.
