Position of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1988 (2011) on the recommendations contained in the tenth report of the Analytical Support and Sanctions Monitoring Team

1. On 30 April 2019, the Analytical Support and Sanctions Monitoring Team submitted its tenth report to the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1988 (2011). The Committee is of the opinion that all Member States should be made aware of the recommendations of the Monitoring Team and the position of the Committee thereon. The paragraph numbers indicated below refer to those in the tenth report of the Monitoring Team.

Specific recommendation related to the issue of radicalization in Pul-e-Charkhi prison

2. In paragraph 66, the Monitoring Team recommended that the Committee write to the Government of Afghanistan to highlight the risk of prison radicalization and attack planning. The Committee will act accordingly and agrees to write to the Government of Afghanistan, highlighting the risk of prison radicalization and attack planning.

Sanctions implementation

3. In paragraph 76, the Monitoring Team recommended that the Committee write to all Member States, recalling their obligations to implement the travel ban as described in Security Council resolution 2255 (2015), in particular to comply with the exemption procedures. The Committee would further encourage Member States likely to host the peace process to consider providing the Committee with a briefing on the outcome and any progress made during the visit, in addition to other reporting obligations, pursuant to resolution 2255 (2015). The Committee will act accordingly and agrees to write to all Member States, recalling their obligations to implement the travel ban as described in resolution 2255 (2015), in particular to comply with the exemption procedures, and further encouraging Member States likely to host the peace process to consider providing the Committee with a briefing on the outcome and any progress made during the visit, in addition to other reporting obligations, pursuant to resolution 2255 (2015).

4. In paragraph 82, the Monitoring Team recommended that the Committee write to all Member States, highlighting the importance of cooperation and information-sharing among financial intelligence units from all States, in the context of the provisions of paragraph 28 of Security Council resolution 2462 (2019), which calls upon States, inter alia, to strengthen international cooperation to prevent and counter the financing of terrorism, including by ensuring the effective exchange of relevant financial intelligence through bilateral and multilateral mechanisms and ensuring that competent authorities are able to exercise their powers to respond to international cooperation requests effectively. The Committee will act accordingly and agrees to write to all Member States, highlighting the importance of cooperation and information-sharing among financial intelligence units from all States, in the context of the provisions of paragraph 28 of resolution 2462 (2019).
