LETTER DATED 27 NOVEMBER 1989 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE
OF EL SALVADOR TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT
OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

On instructions from my Government, I request you to convene the Security Council, as a matter of urgency, on Wednesday, 29 November 1989, to consider actions by the Nicaraguan Government which constitute breaches of the regional agreements concluded by the Central American Presidents, specifically the Procedure for the establishment of a firm and lasting peace in Central America I/ (Esquipulas II agreement), the Joint Declaration of the Central American Presidents 2/ (Tesoro Beach agreement) and the recent Tela agreement. 3/ In the Security Council, an account will be given of those actions, which reflect a policy of intervention and aggression against El Salvador on the part of the Sandinista Government.

My Government believes that unless these serious breaches of the aforementioned regional agreements are brought to an end, not only will peace in Central America be threatened but a conflict with incalculable consequences might be unleashed in the region.
