**LETTER DATED 24 SEPTEMBER 1991 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE
OF YUGOSLAVIA TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT
OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL**

In my capacity as Permanent Representative of Yugoslavia to the United Nations I have the honour to inform you that my Government welcomes the decision that has been taken, at the initiative of Belgium, France and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, to call a meeting of the Security Council to discuss the situation in Yugoslavia.

The Federal Secretary for Foreign Affairs of Yugoslavia, H.E. Mr. Budimir Loncar, wishes himself to participate in that meeting and would be grateful if the Council could agree to that.

I am hopeful that the Security Council will be able to adopt a resolution at that meeting which would contribute to the current efforts to bring peace to all Yugoslavs.

I would be grateful if you could arrange for this letter to be circulated to all members of the Security Council,
