The Permanent Mission of the Republic of Belarus to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1591 (2005) concerning the Sudan and with reference to the latter's note dated 29 October 2009 has the honour to forward the attached report on the actions taken by the Republic of Belarus to implement measures imposed by the Security Council in resolutions 1591 (2005) and 1556 (2004) (see annex).

In accordance with paragraph 5 of Security Council resolution 1891 (2009), we wish to report on the measures taken to implement the resolution in the Republic of Belarus.

The State bodies of the Republic of Belarus authorized to issue export and import permits for military goods have adopted measures to prevent the sale or supply of arms and related materiel of all types, including weapons and ammunition, and to prohibit the provision of technical training or assistance in accordance with paragraphs 7 and 8 of Security Council resolution 1556 (2004).

Pursuant to paragraphs 3 (d) and (e) of Security Council resolution 1591 (2005), the relevant national authorities of the Republic of Belarus are monitoring the individuals and entities listed in the resolution.

Financial organizations in the Republic of Belarus are being advised to exercise vigilance and to follow in their work the provisions of the resolution concerning the freezing of financial assets and economic resources that are owned or controlled by individuals designated by the Committee in accordance with paragraphs 3 (c) and (e). There is constant monitoring of the provision of grants, financial assistance and concessional loans to individuals or organizations designated by the Committee.

In the course of an inspection, no evidence was found of financial transactions carried out between banks or financial institutions in the Republic of Belarus and the individuals and entities subject to the freezing of financial assets listed in the resolution.

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
