

The Permanent Mission of the Republic of Lithuania to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006) and, pursuant to paragraph 22 of Security Council resolution 1874 (2009), has the honour to submit the report of the Republic of Lithuania on the implementation of the provisions of resolutions 1718 (2006) and 1874 (2009) (see annex).

Report of the Republic of Lithuania pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 22 of Security Council resolution 1874 (2009)

Lithuania implements its policies towards the Democratic People's Republic of Korea together with the other member States of the European Union. Provisions of paragraph 8 of Security Council resolution 1718 (2006) have been implemented in Lithuania by directly applicable Council Regulation (EC) No. 329/2007 of 27 March 2007 concerning restrictive measures against the Democratic People's Republic of Korea.

Provisions of paragraphs 9 and 10 of Security Council resolution 1874 (2009) concerning restrictive measures applying to all arms and related materiel are implemented by the respective Governmental Resolution including the Democratic People's Republic of Korea in the list of the countries under arms embargo (including small arms and light weapons).

The provisions of paragraphs 18, 19 and 20 of Security Council resolution 1874 (2009) concerning financial restrictions are directly implemented upon the adoption or amendment of the relevant regulation of the Council of the European Union.

The national legislation of Lithuania applies a rigorous national export control policy towards the Democratic People's Republic of Korea covering restrictions of the transfers of conventional arms, dual-use goods and technologies related to nuclear, chemical, biological and missiles activities.

The items subject to nuclear, chemical, biological and missiles activities but not listed in the European Union Common Military List and annex I of Council Regulation (EC) No. 428/2009 of 5 May 2009 setting up a Community regime for the control of exports, transfer, brokering and transit of dual-use items are controlled under the "catch-all" provision of article 4 of the said regulation.

Concerning embargo on luxury goods, restrictions on admission and freezing of funds and economic resources, competent Lithuanian authorities have been informed about imposed restrictive measures in order to exercise exclusive vigilance towards the Democratic People's Republic of Korea. The information of imposed sanctions has been uploaded on the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Lithuania.
