Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006)

Letter dated 10 November 2009 from the Permanent Representative of Peru to the United Nations addressed to the Chairman of the Committee

I have the honour to supplement the information sent with my note dated 22 September 2009 on the measures adopted by the Peruvian Government to ensure the effective implementation of the provisions of Security Council resolutions 1718 (2006) and 1874 (2009).

In that connection, I would like to inform you that:

- The Ministry of Defence has not, to date, received any information which would provide reasonable grounds to seek the consent of the flag State for intervention and inspection of a vessel that is transiting Peruvian waters (paragraphs 12 and 13 of resolution 1874 (2009)). Instructions have been given for the General Directorate of Port Authorities and Coastguards to submit a report whenever it conducts an inspection or seizes cargo or whenever a flag State does not cooperate, in compliance with paragraphs 15 and 16 of resolution 1874 (2009).
- In turn, the General Directorate of Port Authorities and Coastguards has issued instructions to port authorities to comply with the provisions of paragraphs 9, 10, 18, 19, 20 and 22 of resolution 1874 (2009).
- To date, no transit to or from the Democratic People's Republic of Korea of material prohibited by the Security Council (paragraph 14 of resolution 1874 (2009)) has been noted.
