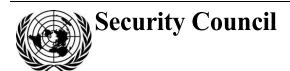

Note verbale dated 27 February 2017 from the Permanent Mission of Tunisia to the United Nations addressed to the Chair of the Committee

The Permanent Mission of Tunisia to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Chair of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006) and has the honour to submit herewith the report of the Tunisian Government on the implementation of Security Council resolutions with regard to the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (see annex).

Report of Tunisia on the implementation of Security Council resolutions 1718 (2006), 1874 (2009), 2087 (2013), 2094 (2013), 2270 (2016) and 2321 (2016)

- Tunisia has always supported efforts by the international community towards the non-proliferation of weapons of mass destruction, based on its unwavering commitment to international peace and security.
- In this connection, it has ratified all legally binding instruments on disarmament currently in force.
- It also makes every effort to fulfil its obligations under Security Council resolutions concerning the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, including the sanctions imposed by resolutions 1718 (2006), 1874 (2009), 2087 (2013), 2094 (2013), 2270 (2016) and 2321 (2016).
- In this context, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs ensures the dissemination to the various competent national authorities of the lists of items prohibited by the Security Council for export to or import from the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, the various updates to the sanctions list of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006) designating persons and entities for the travel ban and/or assets freeze, the relevant Security Council resolutions as they are adopted, and the relevant implementation assistance notes.
- The Tunisian Government further affirms that it does not engage in the supply or sale to the Democratic People's Republic of Korea of items, materials, equipment or goods that could contribute to the violation of the provisions of Security Council resolutions concerning that country, and in particular, those concerning arms and related materiel, non-proliferation, fuel and luxury goods.
- The Tunisian Government also wishes to emphasize that it has not entered into any financial transactions with the Democratic People's Republic of Korea.
- Lastly, it has not established any scientific and technical cooperation programmes with that country.
