**Report of New Zealand on the implementation of Security Council
resolution [2321 \(2016\)](#)**

In paragraph 36 of Security Council resolution [2321 \(2016\)](#), the Council called upon all States to report to the Council within 90 days of the adoption of the resolution, and thereafter upon request by the Committee, on concrete measures they had taken in order to implement effectively the provisions of the resolution.

New Zealand wishes to inform the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution [1718 \(2006\)](#) that many provisions of resolution [2321 \(2016\)](#) are already being implemented through New Zealand's current policy and the existing United Nations Sanctions (Democratic People's Republic of Korea) Regulations 2006 (last amended in 2013). Implementation of the remaining provisions of the resolution is well under way. In that regard, New Zealand takes note of Implementation Assistance Notice No. 2: guidelines on the preparation and submission of national implementation reports, as most recently updated on 25 January 2017 by the Committee. New Zealand will submit an additional report to the Committee as soon as the domestic process to implement the remaining provisions is complete.
