


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Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006)

Note verbale dated 10 July 2017 from the Permanent Mission of Slovenia to the United Nations addressed to the Chair of the Committee

The Permanent Mission of the Republic of Slovenia to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Chair of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006) and has the honour to transmit, pursuant to the letter dated 15 June 2017 from the Panel of Experts, the report of the Republic of Slovenia on the implementation of Security Council resolutions 1874 (2009), 2087 (2013), 2094 (2013), 2270 (2016), 2321 (2016) and 2356 (2017) (see annex).

Report of Slovenia on the implementation of Security Council resolutions 1874 (2009), 2087 (2013), 2094 (2013), 2270 (2016), 2321 (2016) and 2356 (2017)

- 1. Slovenia and the other States members of the European Union have jointly implemented the restrictive measures against the Democratic People's Republic of Korea imposed by Security Council resolutions 1874 (2009), 2087 (2013), 2094 (2013), 2270 (2016), 2321 (2016) and 2356 (2017), by way of the following measures:
 - Council Decision (CFSP) 2016/849 of 27 May 2016 concerning restrictive measures against the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and repealing Decision 2013/183/CFSP, as amended most recently by Council Decision (CFSP) 2017/994 of 12 June 2017. European Union member States must ensure that their national policies conform to such decisions.
 - Council Regulation (EC) No. 329/2007 of 27 March 2007 concerning restrictive measures against the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, as amended most recently by Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2017/993 of 12 June 2017. Regulations of the Council of the European Union are binding in their entirety and directly applicable in Slovenia.
- 2. Slovenia implements the above-mentioned Security Council resolutions and European Union legal acts, within its competence in relation to the European Union, as well as through its relevant national legislation. To that effect, it has adopted several implementation measures with regard to the Democratic People's Republic of Korea on the basis of the act regulating restrictive measures introduced or implemented in accordance with legal instruments and decisions adopted by international organizations (statutory instrument No. 127/2006 of the Official Journal of the Republic of Slovenia), currently consolidated in the decree on restrictive measures against the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and on the implementation of European Union regulations relating to these restrictive measures (statutory instrument No. 18/2017 of the Official Journal). Certain general legal acts also apply in relation to those restrictive measures, such as the Criminal Code, the Liability of Legal Persons for Criminal Offences Act, the Foreigners Act, the Defence Act, the Firearms Act and the Act Regulating the Control of Exports of Dual-Use Items.

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
