



Note verbale dated 13 July 2017 from the Permanent Mission of Ethiopia to the United Nations addressed to the Chair of the Committee

The Permanent Mission of the Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006) and has the honour to transmit herewith the national implementation report of the Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia on Security Council resolution 2321 (2016), in accordance with paragraph 36 of the resolution (see annex).

The Government of the Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia is committed to continuing to implement Security Council resolution 2321 (2016) and other related Council resolutions on the Democratic People's Republic of Korea.

Report of Ethiopia on the implementation of Security Council resolution 2321 (2016)

The Government of the Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia continues to implement the sanctions and restrictive measures against the Democratic People's Republic of Korea imposed by the Security Council through resolution 2321 (2016).

Ethiopia has no scientific or technical cooperation with the Democratic People's Republic of Korea. It has no cooperation or interaction involving persons or groups that are under the Security Council sanctions list, except for a diplomatic mission in Ethiopia. In accordance with Council resolutions 2270 (2016) and 2321 (2016), the Government of the Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia has taken the following measures:

- (a) It has informed the relevant ministries, including the National Intelligence and Security Service, and Ethiopian Airlines, through a circular, of the individuals under the Security Council sanctions;
- (b) It has imposed a restriction on entry into or transit through Ethiopia of members of the Government and officials of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and members of that country's armed forces associated with nuclear and ballistic missile programmes;
- (c) The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia is currently working in coordination with the National Bank of Ethiopia to take measures to limit the number of bank accounts of the embassy of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and its diplomats and consular officers to one account.

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
