ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

The agenda was adopted.

THE SITUATION IN NAMIBIA

The PRESIDENT: The Security Council will now begin its consideration of the item on its agenda. The Security Council is meeting today in accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's consultations. Members of the Council have before them the texts of the two draft resolutions prepared in the course of the Council's consultations, contained in documents S/20399 and S/20400 in their provisional form. In this connection, I should like to draw attention to a change in the order of the paragraphs in the draft resolution contained in document S/20400. Paragraphs 3 and 4 of the draft resolution should be reversed: that is, paragraph 3 should be renumbered paragraph 4, and the original paragraph 4 should be renumbered paragraph 3.

Members of the Council also have the following documents before them: S/20325, note verbale dated 14 December 1988 from the Chargé d'affaires ad interim of the Permanent Mission of the United States of America to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General; S/20345, letter dated 22 December 1988 from the Permanent Representative of Cuba to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council; and S/20346, note verbale dated 22 December 1988 from the Permanent Representative of the United States of America to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General.

(The President)

It is my understanding that the Security Council is ready to proceed to the vote on the draft resolutions before it. If I hear no objection, I shall take it that that is the case. There being no objection, it is so decided.

I shall put to the vote first the draft resolution contained in document S/20399.

A vote was taken by show of hands.

In favour: Algeria, Brazil, Canada, China, Colombia, Ethiopia, Finland, France, Malaysia, Nepal, Senegal, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America, Yugoslavia

The PRESIDENT: There were 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution has therefore been adopted unanimously as resolution 628 (1989).

I shall now put to the vote the draft resolution contained in document S/20400 as orally modified.

A vote was taken by show of hands.

In favour: Algeria, Brazil, Canada, China, Colombia, Ethiopia, Finland, France, Malaysia, Nepal, Senegal, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America, Yugoslavia

The PRESIDENT: There were 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution as orally modified has therefore been adopted unanimously as resolution 629 (1989).

The Security Council has thus concluded the present stage of its consideration of the item on the agenda.

The meeting rose at 5.15 p.m.
