ADMISSION OF NEW MEMBERS

LETTER DATED 6 JANUARY 1992 FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF UZBEKISTAN ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL (S/23451)

The PRESIDENT: The Security Council will now begin its consideration of the item on its agenda. In a letter dated 6 January 1992 addressed to the Secretary-General, the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan submitted the application of his country for membership in the United Nations. That letter has been circulated in document S/23451.

Under the provisions of rule 59 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, unless the Council decides otherwise, an application for membership shall be referred by the President of the Council to the Committee on the Admission of New Members. Accordingly, unless I hear a proposal to the contrary, I shall refer the application of the Republic of Uzbekistan to the Committee on the Admission of New Members for examination and report.

As I hear no objection, it is so decided.

I propose that the Committee on the Admission of New Members meet on Friday, 24 January 1992, in Conference Room 7, following the adjournment of the meeting concerning the application of the Republic of Kyrgyzstan, in order to consider the application of the Republic of Uzbekistan for membership in the United Nations.

The meeting rose at 5.37 p.m.
