It is my understanding that the Council is ready to proceed to the vote on the draft resolution (S/1996/139)

before it. Unless I hear any objection, I shall put the draft resolution to the vote now.

There being no objection, it is so decided.

**The President**: There were 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution has been adopted unanimously as resolution 1047 (1996).

Let me say, as President of the Council, that I am very pleased that we are able to provide a seamless transition for the important work of the war crimes Tribunals. I think that this is a great step forward and that we should all be proud.

The Security Council has thus concluded the present stage of its consideration of the item on its agenda. The Security Council will remain seized of the matter.
