Report of the Secretary-General on children and armed conflict (S/2001/852)

Members of the Council have before them document S/2001/1093, which contains the text of a draft resolution prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultation.

It is my understanding that the Council is ready to proceed to the vote on the draft resolution before it.

The President: There were 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution has been adopted unanimously as resolution 1379 (2001).
