## The situation in Timor-Leste

Special report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Mission of Support in East Timor (S/2003/243)

The President (spoke in Spanish): I should like to inform the Council that I have received a letter from the representative of Timor-Leste, in which he requests to be invited to participate in the discussion of the item on the Council's agenda. In conformity with the usual practice, I propose, with the consent of the Council, to invite that representative to participate in the discussion, without the right to vote, in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter and rule 37 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure.

There being no objection, it is so decided.

At the invitation of the President, Mr. Guterres (Timor-Leste) took a seat at the Council table.

**The President** (*spoke in Spanish*): The Security Council will now begin its consideration of the item on its agenda.

The Council is meeting in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

Members of the Council have before them the Special report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Mission of Support in East Timor, document S/2003/243.

Members of the Council also have before them document S/2003/401, which contains the text of a draft resolution prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

I should like to draw the attention of the members of the Council to a letter dated 3 April 2003 from the United Kingdom addressed to the President of the Security Council, which has been issued as document S/2003/379.

It is my understanding that the Security Council is ready to proceed to the vote on the draft resolution (S/2003/401) before it. If I hear no objection, I shall now put the draft resolution to the vote.

There being no objection, it is so decided.

A vote was taken by show of hands.

In favour:

Angola, Bulgaria, Cameroon, Chile, China, France, Germany, Guinea, Mexico, Pakistan, Russian Federation, Spain, Syrian Arab Republic, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America

**The President** (*spoke in Spanish*): There were 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution has been adopted unanimously as resolution 1473 (2003).

The Security Council has thus concluded the present stage of its consideration of the item on its agenda.
