The situation in Burundi

Seventh report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Integrated Office in Burundi (S/2010/608)

The President: Members of the Council have before them document S/2010/640, containing the text of a draft resolution submitted by France, Gabon, Japan, Lebanon, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and the United States of America.

Members of the Council also have before them document S/2010/608, containing the seventh report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Integrated Office in Burundi.

It is my understanding that the Council is ready to proceed to the vote on the draft resolution before it. Unless I hear any objection, I shall put the draft resolution to the vote now.

There being no objection, it is so decided.

A vote was taken by show of hands.

In favour:

Austria, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brazil, China, France, Gabon, Japan, Lebanon, Mexico, Nigeria, Russian Federation, Turkey, Uganda, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America

The President: There were 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution has been adopted unanimously as resolution 1959 (2010).

The Security Council has thus concluded the present stage of its consideration of the item on its agenda.
