Registration data on space launches by the Russian Federation in May 2018^{*}

1. In May 2018, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects included, in accordance with established practice and its international obligations, in the register of space objects launched by the Russian Federation and over which it has control.

2. In May 2018, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects on behalf of foreign clients.

3. As at 2400 hours Moscow time on 31 May 2018, no space objects belonging to the Russian Federation had been found to have ceased to exist in Earth orbit in May 2018.
