## ANNEX

## Statement issued on 2 April 1987 by a spokesman of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan

There has been no **sign** of improvement in the **deplorable** situation **brought** about by the Soviet military intervention in Afghanistan. It is most rearettable that the **Afghan régime** continues, and **recently** has even intensified, its **bombing** of Pakistani territory, resultins in the loss of many innocent lives.

At the initiative of the Secretary-General of the **United** Nations, efforts have been made towards a Political settlement of the **Afghan** Droblem, and **Japan** has extended them its full support. The above-mentioned bombina attacks are **incompatible** with these international efforts.

Japan stronaly denounces the **bombing** of Pakistani territory by the Afahan **régime** and calls for an immediate cessation of such acts.
