Summary

The present report was mandated by General Assembly resolution 58/104 and contains a list of specialized agencies and international institutions associated with the United Nations to which the provisions of the resolution apply and to whose attention the Secretary-General drew the text of the resolution.

1. At its fifty-eighth session, the General Assembly adopted resolution 58/104 of 9 December 2003 concerning the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples by the specialized agencies and the international institutions associated with the United Nations. In paragraph 16 of that resolution, the Assembly requested the Secretary-General to continue to assist the specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system in working out appropriate measures for implementing the relevant resolutions of the United Nations and to prepare for submission to the relevant bodies, with the assistance of those agencies and organizations, a report on the action taken in implementation of the relevant resolutions, including resolution 58/104, since the circulation of his previous report.

2. In a letter dated 6 February 2004, the Secretary-General brought the text of the resolution to the attention of the executive heads of the following specialized agencies and other international organizations and invited them to submit the information requested for inclusion in the report referred to in the above paragraph:
