21A. One reply 69a/ commented on the final clause of article 7 (5) ("otherwise ... when performance is due."). It was suggested that this clause was superfluous. Moreover, it was suggested that there was no justification for speaking of the prescriptive period as commencing to run from "the date when performance is due" except when performance has not taken place by that date. The reply also referred to the wording of article 7 (1) in which the date of breach of contract test is adopted; it was noted that the language of article 7 (1) is inconsistent with that of article 7 (5).
