#### **Addendum**

#### **Fifty-third session of the Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf**

Further to my letter dated 13 April 2020 ([SPLOS/30/10](#)) and the addendum dated 7 May 2020 ([SPLOS/30/10/Add.1](#)), the present addendum is to inform States parties to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea that, in the light of the situation concerning the coronavirus disease (COVID-19), the Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf has conducted an assessment of the feasibility of advancing the work of the Commission and its subcommissions by other means. In this regard, the Commission has decided to: (a) postpone the fifty-third session<sup>1</sup> to yet-to-be-determined dates owing to issues related to, inter alia, time zone differences, the privacy and security of virtual deliberations of the subcommissions, and remote data-sharing; and (b) continue to assess the feasibility of advancing the work of the Commission and its subcommissions by other means, including possibilities for secure online deliberations on submission material and of defraying the cost related to online work by members from developing States, as needed, with a view to the potential need for remote work in the context of the sessions of the Commission, should the COVID-19 pandemic continue.
