La Mission permanente de la Norvège a le plaisir de transmettre ci-joint un tableau national actualisé des mesures prises par les autorités norvégiennes pour mettre en œuvre la résolution [1540 \(2004\)](#) du Conseil de sécurité et les obligations de non-prolifération figurant dans les résolutions [1673 \(2006\)](#), [1810 \(2008\)](#), [1977 \(2011\)](#), [2055 \(2012\)](#) et [2325 \(2016\)](#) (voir annexe).

**Rapport national de la Norvège sur la mise en œuvre
de la résolution 1540 (2004) du Conseil de sécurité**

La Norvège a le plaisir de communiquer ci-joint un tableau national actualisé des mesures qu'elle a prises pour mettre en œuvre la résolution 1540 (2004) du Conseil de sécurité et les obligations de non-prolifération figurant dans les résolutions 1673 (2006), 1810 (2008), 1977 (2011), 2055 (2012) et 2325 (2016) (voir pièce jointe)¹.

La Norvège considère que la résolution 1540 (2004) du Conseil de sécurité est un élément essentiel de l'architecture internationale de non-prolifération. Dans sa résolution, le Conseil impose à tous les États de prendre et d'appliquer des mesures efficaces afin de mettre en place des dispositifs intérieurs de contrôle destinés à prévenir la prolifération des armes nucléaires, chimiques ou biologiques et de leurs vecteurs, y compris en mettant en place des dispositifs de contrôle appropriés pour les matières connexes. Il engage également au dialogue et à la coopération sur le plan international, de sorte à apporter des réponses aux menaces que fait peser la prolifération.

Le danger provenant des acteurs non étatiques est de plus en plus grand. Étant donné sa nature transnationale, il faut y répondre par la coopération internationale. Il est de la responsabilité conjointe de la communauté mondiale de renforcer et de respecter les normes et règles applicables, afin que s'accroissent dans le monde la stabilité, la sûreté et le développement. La Norvège demeure un ardent défenseur de l'universalisation et du renforcement des régimes multilatéraux visant à prévenir la prolifération des armes nucléaires, biologiques et chimiques, tels que le Traité sur la non-prolifération, la Convention sur les armes chimiques et la Convention sur les armes biologiques.

Il est primordial que tous les États Membres de l'Organisation des Nations Unies mettent pleinement en œuvre la résolution 1540 (2004), et la Norvège s'efforce de coopérer avec tous les États et les parties concernées en vue d'intensifier les efforts de promotion de son application universelle.

Depuis son rapport figurant dans les documents publiés respectivement sous les cotes S/AC.44/2004/(02)/31 et S/AC.44/2004/(02)/31/Add.1, la Norvège a ratifié les instruments internationaux suivants :

- Amendement à la Convention sur la protection physique des matières nucléaires
- Convention internationale pour la répression des actes de terrorisme nucléaire
- Protocole de 2005 à la Convention pour la répression d'actes illicites contre la sécurité de la navigation maritime
- Protocole de 2005 relatif au Protocole pour la répression d'actes illicites contre la sécurité des plates-formes fixes situées sur le plateau continental
- Convention sur la répression des actes illicites dirigés contre l'aviation civile internationale

The information in the matrices originates primarily from national reports and is complemented by official government information, including that made available to inter-governmental organizations. The matrices are prepared under the direction of the 1540 Committee.

The 1540 Committee intends to use the matrices as a reference tool for facilitating technical assistance and to enable the Committee to continue to enhance its dialogue with States on their implementation of Security Council Resolution 1540.

The matrices are not a tool for measuring compliance of States in their non-proliferation obligations but for facilitating the implementation of Security Council Resolutions [1540 \(2004\)](#), [1673 \(2006\)](#), [1810 \(2008\)](#), [1977 \(2011\)](#), [2055 \(2012\)](#) and [2325 \(2016\)](#). They do not reflect or prejudice any ongoing discussions outside of the Committee, in the Security Council or any of its organs, of a State's compliance with its non-proliferation or any other obligations. Information on voluntary commitments is for reporting purpose only and does not constitute in any way a legal obligation arising from resolution 1540 or its successive resolutions.

Matrix entries are only indicators of fact and not indicators of the degree of compliance under resolution [1540 \(2004\)](#) and its successor resolutions. Thus:

An “X” in any data field signifies only that the 1540 Committee considers that a State has taken the steps required, and/or has provided specific references to the applicable legal basis or executive behaviour as evidence of such steps. An “X” against any data field does not necessarily signify that a State has met in full its 1540 obligations for that data field.

A “?” in any data field signifies that the references to legislative or other measures may not be directly relevant or are incomplete.

A “NA” (Not Applicable) in any data field signifies that the data field is not applicable to that State where through legally binding instruments States specified that they do not possess related materials or facilities.

A blank in any data field signifies that there is insufficient information available to enter an “X” or “?” against a particular data field.
