NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

1. At the 113th plenary meeting of its fortieth session, on 12 December 1985, the General Assembly adopted resolution 40/89, entitled "Implementation of the Declaration on the Denuclearization of Africa". 1/

2. In paragraphs 8 and 9 of resolution B, the General Assembly

"8. Requests the Security Council, for the purposes of disarmament and to fulfil its obligations and responsibility, to take enforcement measures to prevent any racist régime from acquiring arms or arms technology;

"9. Further requests the Security Council to conclude expeditiously its consideration of the recommendations of its Committee established by resolution 421 (1977) concerning the question of South Africa, 2/ with a view to blocking the existing loopholes in the arms embargo so as to render it more effective, and prohibiting, in particular, all forms of co-operation and collaboration with the racist régime of South Africa in the nuclear field".
