Reports of the Secretary-General on the Sudan

Report of the Secretary-General on the Sudan (S/2011/239)

The President (*spoke in Spanish*): Under rule 37 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure, I invite the representative of the Sudan to participate in this meeting.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, and under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure, I invite Mr. David Buom Choat, Political, United Nations, Congressional Affairs Officer of the Government of Southern Sudan, to participate in this meeting.

The Security Council will now begin its consideration of the item on its agenda.

Members of the Council have before them document S/2011/267, which contains the text of a draft resolution submitted by the United States of America. I wish also to draw the attention of Council members to document S/2011/239, which contains the report of the Secretary-General on the Sudan.

It is my understanding that the Council is ready to proceed to the vote on the draft resolution before it.

In favour:

Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brazil, China, Colombia, France, Gabon, Germany, India, Lebanon, Nigeria, Portugal, Russian Federation, South Africa, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America

The President (*spoke in Spanish*): There were 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution has been adopted unanimously as resolution 1978 (2011).

The Security Council has thus concluded the present stage of its consideration of the item on its agenda.

The meeting rose at 10.35 a.m.
